

## Connecting to the Wireless Network (Eduroam)

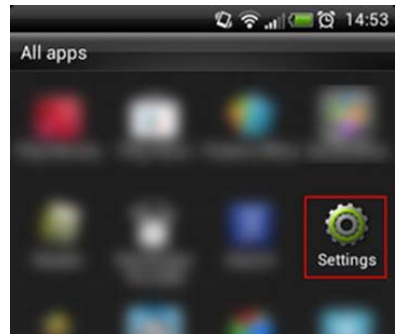
eduroam allows staff and students to take their wireless devices to other educational institutions worldwide, that support eduroam, and connect using their De Montfort University username and password. You can access eduroam where you see this logo.



### How to connect to eduroam using Android phones & tablets

These instructions are for android 2.1 or later

- From the main menu, tap **Settings**
- Now tap Wi-Fi



- In the list of Wi-Fi networks, tap **eduroam**

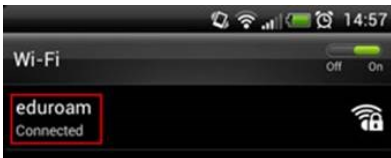


- You may be prompted to set a password for credential storage. This is a new password personal to your device and must have at least 8 characters.
- Enter the following details:

<b>Security Type</b>	PEAP
<b>Phase 2 Authentication</b>	MSCHAPv2
<b>Identity</b>	Students: P-Number@dmu.ac.uk e.g. P1234567x@dmu.ac.uk Staff: username@dmu.ac.uk e.g. fblogs00@dmu.ac.uk Please note, this <b>is not</b> your e-mail address
<b>Password</b>	Students: Your MyDMU or Blackboard password Staff: Your Staff Portal or Blackboard password

- Click **Connect**

- You should now be connected to eduroam Wi-Fi
